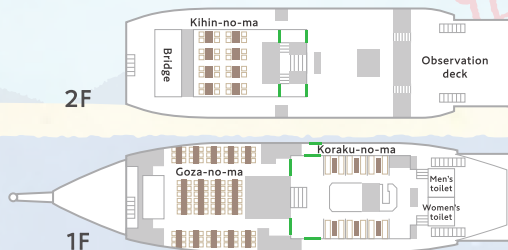


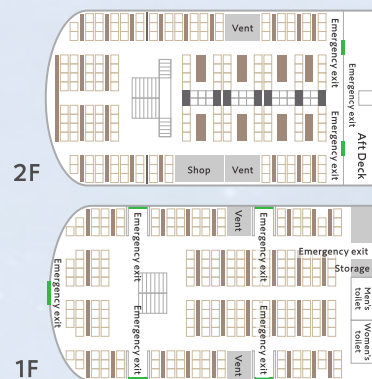
Ship Layout

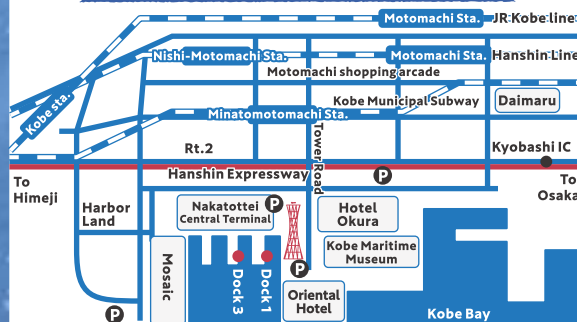

1 Kobe Harbor Land

Stylish waterfront quarters lined with shops and amusement facilities. The nighttime view from the mosaic gardens Ferris wheel is beautiful.

2 Kawasaki Heavy Industries

Special ships (jetfoils, submarines, etc.) are constructed and repaired here. It is the home of Japan's biggest floating dock (for repairing/inspecting ships).

3 Self-defense Force Submarine

The self-defense force submarines are only made and repaired at Kawasaki and Mitsubishi shipyards. This is a highly recommended spot for submarine fans.

4 Mitsubishi Heavy Industries

Large-scale container ships and luxury cruise liners were constructed here.

5 Akashi-Kaikyo Bridge

The Akashi-Kaikyo bridge can be viewed from afar (Approx. 20km away)

6 Kobe #1 Breakwater east Lighthouse

With "Kobeko" painted in large letters, it is the only lighthouse in Japan labelled with the port name. This is an unusual point of interest

7 Kobe Airport

View Kobe airport, which was opened on Feb. 16th, 2006.

8 Port Island

Completed in 1981, this is the first city on a man-made island in Japan. With facilities such as an international conference hall and Kobe animal kingdom, the maritime city is currently home to around 15,000 people.

9 Kobe Bridge

Connecting Port terminal with port island, this is the first crimson double deck arch bridge in Japan and spans 319m. It is also pretty at night.

10 Nakatottei and Meriken Park

The 108m tall port tower and maritime museum designed as a sailing ship, the semi-elliptical Meriken Park oriental Hotel, and the 135m high Okura Hotel represent the scenery of Kobe.

Gozabune-Atakemaru

45min. Course
Capacity: 500 people

The Gozabune-Atakemaru is themed on the "Atakemaru" a great ship built on the orders of the 3rd Edo shogunate, Iemitsu. After ending its role in Tokyo bay in May, 2021, it came to Kobe bay as a sightseeing ship. It had renewal work in 2017 under the direction of Eiji Mitooka. The interior combines Eastern and Western styles with the abundant use of warm wood, curtains and noren dividers, and a mandala-like design.



Royal Princess

40min. Course
Capacity: 500 people

The largest luxury pleasure ship in Kansai. The central staircase leads to the second deck and has a luxurious build not expected from a pleasure ship. The spacious ship lets you fully enjoy Kobe port. The addition of the 3rd Skydeck in March, 2020 gives an impressive view when passing under Kobe bridge.
